The Dept of Commence requires 10 years of site control. If you have plans to eventually gain control, please explain how and when this will happen, and the rating panel will consider your proposal. Are there maximum award levels?	There is a maximum award level of \$2M for the Property Acquisition and/or Development Program Area but the other two categories have up to \$2.8M in requests.	Chief Seattle Club, Annie Xuan Clark
If we wanted to apply for all three-program areas to we have to apply for each separately?	Yes, you will complete one coversheet and separate applications for each program area. There is not a specific budget split for the other two program areas. The amount of funding available for Operations and Behavioral Health/Support services is up to \$2.8M ongoing funding pending funding availability and customer satisfaction with programming.
