4. CEO Update

- As of today, KCRHA has 32 employees and is still growing in the first nine months of operation.
- Grants & Contracts Management Systems are up and running, MSA's and PSA have been received by providers.
- First Budget Cycle shows 66% funding coming from The City of Seattle, 34% from King County.
- Sub-Regional Planning staff are working across the county and jurisdictions to understand the needs and begin building specific plans for those communities.

- KCRHA first Hiring Poll shows: 61% P.O.C., 61% Women, 42% identify as LGBQT, 5% Trans, 50% Lived Experienced.
- A Dataset and Analysis with King County revealed a higher number of folks experiencing homelessness than previously reported.

5. 2022 Final Budget Presentation and Vote

- **On 1/12/22** Actions taken by the Implementation Board approved the KCRHA 2022 Final Budget. *Letter from Implementation Board read by Marc Dones*
- Action from the Governing Committee to approve KCRHA 2022 Final Budget by a $\frac{2}{3}$ vote.
- Council approved two Provisos:
 - Proviso 1 \$800k of the #3.6M for COVID Mitigation
 - Proviso 2 \$10.7M of City Base Contracts for Tiny Home Villages
- City of Seattle 2022 Budget Earmarks
 - \$185k to maintain vehicle resident outreach and parking offense mitigation.
 - \$100k to expand homelessness day center services (God' Lil Acre)
 - \$980k Camp Second Chance Village Expansion and Behavioral Health Services (2 adds LIHI)

Approval Action taken by the Board - Angela Birney, Motions to approve the KCRHA 2022 Final Budget, Mayor Nancy Backus Seconds, vote by roll call. The 2022 KCRHA Final Budget passes with 12 Yeas/0 Nae/0 Abstensions.

Severe Weather & Omicron Updates

- During the Severe Weather Event
 - 27 Sites were in Operation
 - 19 Operators
 - 900+ Units (Beds/Rooms) at full activation
 - Added capacity during the SWS 260+ additional units (Beds/Rooms)
- Lessons Learned
 - Transportation
 - Food/Meal Access
 - Holiday/Weekend limiting available indoor day space
 - Staffing
 - COVID 0 Omicron exposure & needs around testing
- Next Steps
 - Debrief with Sub Regional Partners
 - Improve communication, coordination and planning with PHSKC and KC Metro & other transportation partners and city emergency management offices.
 - Reconnecting with the activated site to confirm participation for the rest of the winter season.
 - Identification of strategies to support the workforce/volunteer base.
