  - Notices have been sent to all the grantees about completing the local application process. First workshop with grantees complete.
- FY22 CoC NOFO Local Application Workshop Current CoC Grantees
  - Due Date September 30, 2022 at 5:00pm
  - Racial Equity Emphasis Revised rating and scoring related to evaluation of racial disparities and whether CoC's and homeless providers have identified barriers that lead to racial disparities, have taken steps to eliminate barriers to improve racial equity and have implemented measures to evaluate the efficacy of the steps taken.
- Emphasis on Support for LGBTQ+ people
  - Revised rating factors for addressing the needs of LGBTQ+ individuals to place greater emphasis on implementing and training on anti-discrimination policies that ensure LGBTQ+ individuals and families receive supportive services, shelter and housing free from discrimination.

- Estimated ARD (Annual Renewal Demand) \$51,526,589 this represents the amount of money HUD saids has to be renewed. We have to do something called tiering. First Tier are the ones we 100% want to be renewed.
  - Tier 1 is equal to 95% of the CoC's Annual Renewal Demand (ARD)

     Does not include YHDP Projects.
  - Tier 2 is the difference between Tier 1 and the maximum amount of renewal, reallocation, and CoC Bonus Funds that a CoC can apply for.
- This year \$2.5 million dollars that can be used to support upcoming permanent supportive housing projects and about \$1.2 million dollars for domestic violence bonus dollars that can be used for rapid rehousing, transitional housing projects or support services for coordinated entry.
- \$1.2 million dollars for CoC to support all the CoC work we do as well as support with the advisory committee, same as last year.
- What we are looking at in the Local Applications that are due August 25, 2022
  - Past grant spending did they spend all the money they were awarded
  - If HUD did monitoring or any HUD audit findings. Timely annual reports submitted - are they drawing down from their grant in a timely fashion.
  - Priority and System measurements Measures program component priorities.
  - Project Match Program must match 25% of their grant from other funding sources, they need to show that CoC money is not the only money supporting that project.
  - Provide a narrative on their housing first practices as well as how they work with folks to connect them to mainstream resources like TANF, Food Assistance, Social Security, Medicaid/Medicare making sure people are getting the support they need.
  - Other narratives Asking folks to expand on their housing first practices their determination and policies, asking folks to expand the narrative of low barrier practices, are they incorporating participant feedback and participation in their program as well as their boards.
  - Narrative on how folks are advancing racial equity and addressing disparity outcomes and other barriers to access housing.
