Subject:Adoption of KCRHA Final 2023 Budget

#### I. Summary & Recommendation

The King County Regional Homelessness Authority (KCRHA):

- 1. Encourages the KCRHA Implementation Board to approve the attached resolution to adopt KCRHA's 2023 Final Budget (attached), based on the City of Seattle and King County adopted budgets; and
- 2. Recommends that the KCRHA Governing Committee adopt the KCRHA's 2023 Final Budget.

#### II. Recommendations

As you recall, in May 2022, the Implementation Board recommended and the Governing Committee approved KCRHA's 2023 Proposed Budget, and authorized the KCRHA to transmit the budget to the City of Seattle and King County for consideration. In September 2022, the Mayor of the City of Seattle and the King County Executive released their proposed 2023-2024 budgets, and in November 2022, the City of Seattle and King County adopted final budgets with modifications incorporated by their Councils.

The KCRHA's 2023 Final Budget totals \$253.3 million, consisting of approved funding from the City of Seattle, King County, the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD), the State of Washington Department of Commerce (Commerce), and private foundations.

The attached presentation describes funding allocated to the KCRHA by the City of Seattle and King County based on their final adopted budgets. Further, these budgets determine how funds allocated to the RHA are to be spent across program types. As such, we request that the budget be adopted as presented.

While the City of Seattle and King County budget allocations are final, in Spring 2023, the Implementation Board will have greater discretion when reviewing the KCHRA's recommended 2024 budget proposal before it is submitted to the City of Seattle and King County for consideration.

# **Key Components of the KCRHA Budget**

#### **Base Budget**

Activities that are supported with ongoing funding. Funding in the base budget is generally assumed to continue from year to year. The RHA budget presentation focuses on additional funding provided over and above Base Funding

#### **Continued One-Time Funding**

One-time grant funds (largely coronavirus relief funds from the Federal Government) that the City of Seattle and King County allocated to the KCRHA in 2022 to support specific programs across multiple fiscal years, but which will expire in 2023 or 2024

#### **Incremental Changes**

Funding for new or enhanced services over and above ongoing funding provided in the Base Budget. Incremental changes funded with ongoing funding will be included in the KCRHA's Base Budget in 2024



# • All KCRHA Funding is provided through contracts with:

- City of Seattle Human Services Department (HSD)
- King County Department of Health and Community Services (DCHS)
- US Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD)
- State of Washington Department of Commerce
- Private Foundations

## • 2022 and 2023 Base Funding

- KCRHA has renewed contracts previously funded by the City and County in 2021 before they were transitioned to the KCRHA in 2022 in our Base Budget
- Once the 5-Year Plan is approved, pursuant to the Interlocal Agreement (ILA) the KCRHA will redesign and re-bid the entire system, including services currently funded with Base Funding in the KCRHA's budget

A RESOLUTION OF THE GOVERNING COMMITTEE OF THE KING COUNTY REGIONAL HOMELESSNESS AUTHORITY TO APPROVE THE AUTHORITY'S 2023 FINAL BUDGET

WHEREAS, Article VIII Sec. 2b(ii) of the Interlocal Agreement for the Establishment of the King County Regional Homelessnes Authority (the "Interlocal Agreement") requires an affirmative vote of a two-thirds of the members present, provided quorum requirements are met, approve the Authority's annual budget; and

WHEREAS, in May 2022, the Implementation Board recommended and the Governing Committee adopted a projected budget to be transmitted to the City of Seattle and King County for consideration; and

WHEREAS, in June 2022 the King County Regional Homelessness Authority submitted the proposed budget approved by the Implementation Board and Governing Committee; and

WHEREAS, King County and the City of Seattle have passed their respective budgets for 2023, which include their contributions to the Authority; and

WHEREAS, the Authority has also identified funding from the Federal and State governments and other entities to support its work,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING COMMITTEE OF THE KING COUNTY REGIONAL HOMELESSNESS AUTHORITY:

<u>Section 1:</u> The Governing Committee approves the final 2023 budget for the King County Regional Homelessness Authority.

<u>Section 2</u>: This resolution shall take effect and be in full force upon passage.
