### 4. KCRHA Updates - CEO Marc Dones

**CEO Dones** provides updates they provided to the Implementation Board addressing three priority encampment programs, noting significant progress being made; also acknowledging what was heard by the public.

Current efforts include three encampments including the one mentioned in public comments. RHA offers various pathways into housing including other forms of existing shelters, resources, emergency shelters and permanent housing as available. We have expanded partnerships with providers to bring in additional resources to de-risk, particularly around fire safety.

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RHA is strategizing how we can better secure sites for those individuals who are not able to exit rapidly into housing that will include dedicated focus on securing site access, ongoing de-risking site for flammable products and also partnering with law enforcement in an ongoing way.
