**Effect Statement:**

This amendment provides consistency with the Executive Summary discussion of congregate shelters beginning at line 428. Language stated below:

428 “Congregate shelters also play an important role in the system as a number of sub-regions  
 429 currently rely on congregate options for emergency shelter. However, congregate shelter  
 430 options tend to vary in terms of whether or not there is an ability to “walk-up” to access  
 shelter,  
 431 and whether or not a program is exclusively available for overnight options or has 24-hour  
 432 access.”
