

2024 Notice of Funding Availability (NOFA)

Continuum of Care - King County Consolidated Rapid Rehousing November 13th, 2023

Overview

The King County Regional Homelessness Authority (KCRHA) is pleased to announce a Notice of Funding Availability (NOFA) for the King County Consolidated Rapid Rehousing (RRH) Continuum of Care (CoC) project. As a result, KCRHA seeks to collaborate with organizations that address the needs of families and single adults experiencing homelessness. KCRHA invites service providers to partner in an ongoing CoC project that provides rapid rehousing for families and single adults. Up to \$1,369,856 in CoC funding will be contracted through an upcoming Request for Proposals (RFP). KCRHA anticipates awarding at minimum one (1) and up to three (3) organizations.

In accordance with KCRHA's <u>Theory of Change</u>, the King County Consolidated Rapid Rehousing Request for Proposals (RFP) is intended to extend the Seattle/King County Continuum of Care's comprehensive, person-centered housing solutions while promoting equity, inclusivity, and better outcomes. By tailoring to the needs of diverse groups and reducing disparities in access to services or resources, KCRHA expects to award funds for organizations that will:

- Engage with families and single adults in Rapid Rehousing services;
- Ensure individuals, youth and young adults, and families receive ongoing support services and operating funds which help residents achieve housing stability and maintain as much independence as possible;
- Ensure all RRH households meet HUD's definition of 'literally homeless' at time of intake;
- Provide services grounded in housing first, trauma-informed care, wellbeing and client centered services;
- Demonstrates how they include or plan to include people with lived expertise of homelessness and disability in policy and program development;
- Advance equity for Black, Indigenous, and other people of color, individuals who identify as LGBTQIA2S+, and individuals with disabilities; and

• Meet data and reporting requirements within the Homeless Management Information System (HMIS).

Successful proposals for the RFP will demonstrate the ability to provide comprehensive Rapid Rehousing services. If you have any questions, please email <u>RFP@kcrha.org</u>.
