# 2024 CoC King County Consolidated Rapid Rehousing RFP Frequently Asked Questions

## **Where can I find the Information Session recording?**

## **Is the Fluxx application open? Can we view the questions without viewing them in Fluxx?**

The Fluxx application will be open on December 29, 2023.

The questions are located on page 10 of the application. You can find the complete application on our [Funding Opportunities](#) webpage [Request for Proposals \(RFP\)](#).

## **Can you provide Certificate of Debarment and Suspension form?**

## **The question about the availability for a 45-minute virtual site visit is absent in Fluxx. Is that intentional or an accident?**

The Fluxx application is currently a draft and will be ready on December 29<sup>th</sup>, 2023. We suggest you work in a Word document until the application is ready, and continue to save your responses in Word so you have a backup.

## **Can funding be used to support temporary operations such as for severe weather?**

This is a long-term project through June 2025. It is a requirement that shelter units are not currently set aside for use by another program (e.g., Seattle's Unified Care Team) and are currently vacant or can be expected to become vacant early in the award period for placements from the State Right of Way initiative (also referred to as the Encampment Response Program).

**Does KCRHA expect to award to a single organization or multiple?**

KCRHA expects to award at least one organization but may award multiple. The program aims to fund enhanced services for an estimated forty (40) total beds. KCRHA will consider applications for smaller unit allocations (e.g. five to twenty beds) from multiple different agencies, as well as applications for the total number of beds that can be supported by a single agency. The total number of funded beds could vary based on the cost of submitted proposals.

**Is it possible to extend when the last day to submit questions is?**

Unfortunately, due to the tight timeline of when funding becomes available, and to ensure this process meets that timeline, we are not able to extend the last day to submit questions for the LOI. All application questions are available in the LOI, and the last day to ask questions related to the LOI is December 29<sup>th</sup>, 2023 at 5:00 PM. The Procurement team is able to provide technical assistance for Fluxx after the last day to submit as long as the questions are not directly related to the LOI.

**How will referrals happen?**

KCRHA will refer individuals to organizations through the State Right of Way Initiative. Beds set aside from this program cannot receive referrals from another program.

**What programs are eligible to apply?**

KCRHA reviewed its existing contracts to identify the projects and agencies that could potentially be eligible to receive funding through this LOI, based on the current contractual relationship with the agency or project (e.g., an existing shelter project). The LOI provides additional details regarding the scope of work and service and eligibility requirements, and not all programs initially identified as eligible will be able to meet those requirements. Agencies will be expected to review the LOI to determine if they can fully meet the criteria to receive funds.

**If our shelter program is already at capacity every night, and don't anticipate adding more capacity, would this disqualify us as a viable applicant?**

A requirement stated by the LOI is that, "Shelter units are not currently set aside for use by another program (e.g., Seattle's Unified Care Team) and are currently vacant or can be expected to become vacant early in the award period for placements from the State Right of Way initiative (also referred to as the Encampment Response Program)."

To be eligible, applicants must be able to set aside beds for this program. The number of beds set aside is determined by applicants.
