My multifaceted homelessness journey offers your position a unique perspective on the challenges and systemic barriers faced by those experiencing housing instability. From navigating domestic violence shelters to engaging with the complexities of the criminal and familial court systems in both Washington and Colorado and facing my own <sup>1</sup>LGBTQIA+ discrimination and violence, I have witnessed firsthand the intersecting issues that contribute to emergency shelters, transitional housing, mental healthcare systems, and even pet-care.
