The King County Regional Homelessness Authority (KCRHA) is pleased to announce a Notice of Funding Availability (NOFA) for outreach services in King County. Interested agencies or firms can submit an application through the 2024 South King County Request for Proposals (RFP) that is expected to become available online on October 24, 2024. KCRHA seeks to collaborate with organizations that provide outreach services that utilize human-centered and harm reduction practices and focus on connecting people experiencing unsheltered homelessness to housing and social services. Successful proposals for the RFP must demonstrate the ability to provide outreach services in South King County¹. Agencies awarded funds must execute a Master Service Agreement (MSA) and Project Service Agreement (PSA) with KCRHA before services can begin. In accordance with [KCRHA's Theory of Change](#), the RFP intends to procure outreach services that support comprehensive, person-centered solutions while promoting equity, inclusivity, and better outcomes. KCRHA expects to award funds to an agency that is able to:

- Meet KCRHA's Minimum Eligibility Requirements
- Engage in outreach services with people experiencing unsheltered homelessness in South King County;
- Practice harm reduction strategies;
- Engage with clients with person-centered and trauma-informed approaches;
- Meet data and reporting requirements within the Homeless Management Information System (HMIS);
- Ensure compliance with local laws and regulations;
- Advance equity for Black, Indigenous, and other people of color as well as individuals who identify as LGBTQ+ and individuals with disabilities.

¹ South King County Encompasses Algona, Auburn, Black Diamond, Burien, Covington, Des Moines, Enumclaw, Federal Way, Kent, Maple Valley, Newcastle, Normandy Park, Pacific, Renton, SeaTac, Tukwila, and unincorporated areas south of Seattle, including but not limited to East Federal Way, Fairwood, Hobart, Skyway, White Center.
