Developing the Workplan

- Used data, input from both quantitative and qualitative analyses of CE
- Both published in 2021
- Used community input and feedback from community via our front-of-house staff
- S.W.O.T. analysis
- SMART framework



2025 Workplan Goals

- Review Coordinated Entry policies & procedures
- Define differences between internal transfers and CE Mobility Requests
- Coordinated Entry Evaluation
- Re-convening the population-based leadership teams (e.g. SALTe)
- Addressing system components; access, assessment, prioritization, referral



Review CE P&P

- Should happen periodically
- New leadership, good time to review
- Opportunity to identify areas for update and discussion with CEC



Mobility Request vs. internal transfer

- Internal: Within one agency, if someone is already housed
- Mobility Request: Needing to be transferred out of agency
- Past CE policy and procedure did not outline differences specifically
- Need to support agencies navigate these transfers



Coordinated Entry Evaluation

- Large undertaking!
- Partnership with Research and Data team (formerly “Community Impact”)
- Key performance indicators: enrollments, assessments, pending referral data, denials, placements, length of process



Population-based Leadership Teams

- Places to promote community collaboration
- Notice overall trends from a provider leadership-level, discuss
- Solicit feedback on system performance from community



System Components

- Work closely with CEC to develop improvements for:
- Access – HMIS vetting policy for providers to become access points
- Prioritization – CEC working on reviewing current tiebreaking policy





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
