The King County Regional Homelessness Authority (KCRHA) is releasing a Notice of Funding Availability (NOFA) to support Washington State's Right-of-Way-Safety initiative, which seeks to connect single adults experiencing unsheltered homelessness state-owned rights of way to permanent housing. The expected Encampment Resolution Program (ERP) Permanent Supportive Housing Services (PSH) Reprocurement Request for Proposals (RFP) is intended to repocure current ERP PSH projects to ensure the scope and performance requirements fit the needs of the community.

Nonprofit organizations, for-profit organizations, faith-based organizations, tribes and tribal organizations are eligible to apply. KCRHA anticipates awarding contracts to a minimum of one (1) and up to five (5) organizations. Organizations that are currently under contract are also eligible to apply if they wish to continue providing services under a new award.

By tailoring to the needs of diverse groups and reducing disparities in access to services or resources, KCRHA expects to award funds for organizations that will provide PSH services to continue operation of the ERP PSH portfolio which consists of approximately 160 master-leased units and 60 privately leased units throughout King County.

KCRHA will give preference to applicants that demonstrate experience and past success in providing PSH services and the ability to provide comprehensive housing operations, tenancy support, and housing stabilization services that promote successful long-term housing retention. Services shall be delivered using a Housing First, person-centered, trauma-informed, culturally responsive, and racially equitable approach that aligns with KCRHA's [Theory of Change](#).
